What's DH?

"...DH today is about a scholarship (and a pedagogy) that is publicly visible in ways to which we are generally unaccustomed, a scholarship and pedagogy that are bound up with infrastructure in ways that are deeper and more explicit than we are generally accustomed to, a scholarship and pedagogy that are collaborative and depend on networks of people and that live an active 24/7 life online."

What's DH?

"Current digital humanities projects are using tools like **3-D**mapping, electronic literary analysis, digitization, and advanced visualization techniques in interdisciplinary research that aims to shed new light on humanities research.
...creators and users experiment and interact with source materials in ways that vield new findings, while also facilitating community building and information sharing."

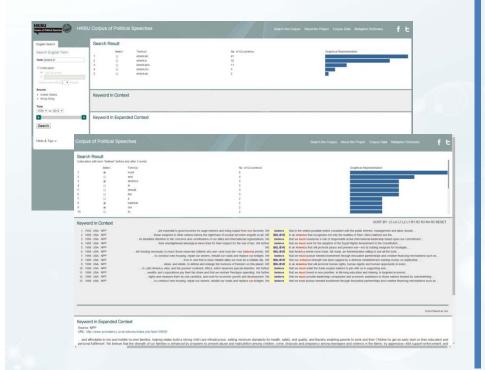

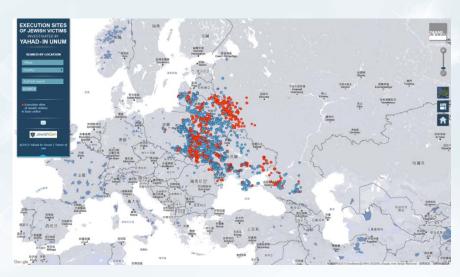
